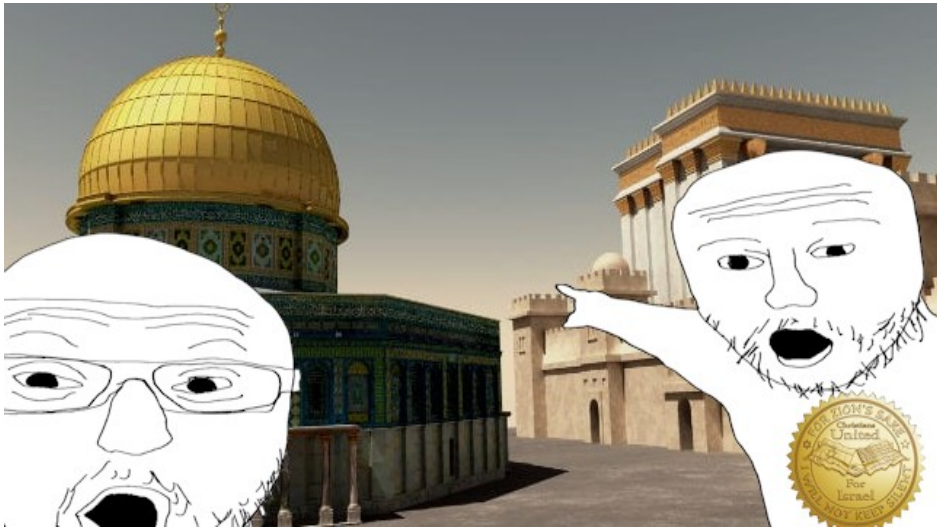
STRIKES AGAIN

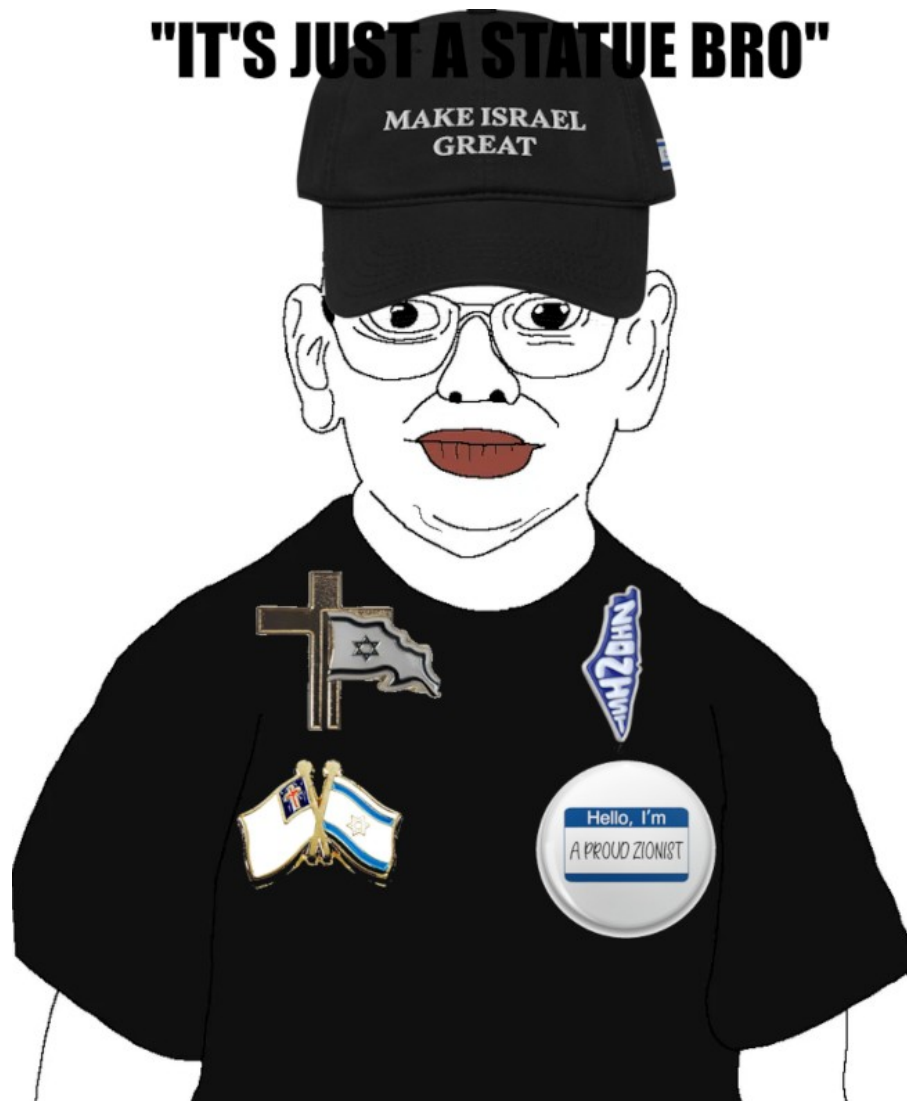
